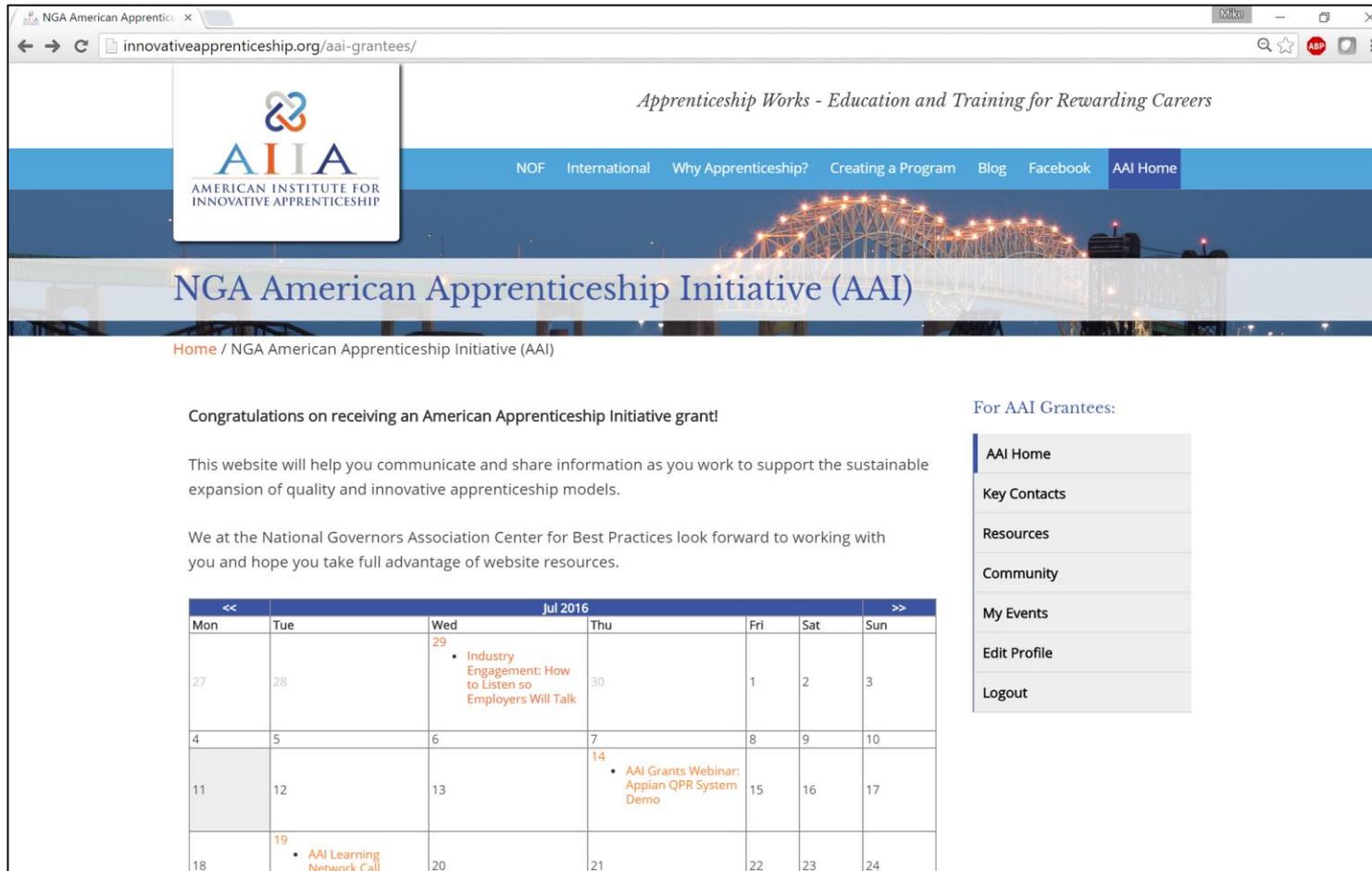

INDUSTRY ENGAGEMENT

Engaging employers in providing insights into industry and workforce needs; becoming partners in design, implementation and investment of resources; and developing longer-term relationships.

PARTNERSHIP BUILDING

Identifying and collaborating with a broad range of partners needed to implement your grant effectively.

ENGAGING UNDERREPRESENTED POPULATIONS

Having a continuum of processes and services that enable you to effectively serve targeted populations.

LEVERAGING RESOURCES

Leveraging local, state, federal, and private sector resources to increase the impacts of grant funding.

DATA-INFORMED DECISION MAKING

Using labor market information, industry and occupational trends, assessment data, and other information to guide investment, programmatic, and other key decisions regarding grant planning, implementation, and system capacity.

POLICY ALIGNMENT

Aligning and connecting with policies and initiatives in workforce development, economic development, education, and other systems to improve grant outcomes and create longer-term conditions for success.

Grantee Self-Assessment

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Grantee Self-Assessment



Examples of guided questions for group discussions about the self-assessment:

1. What areas represent our strengths? Why?
2. What areas represent learning opportunities?
3. Is there important work that we are not doing? If so, what?
4. Do we have different points of view within our organization, or among our partners, about our self-assessment scoring?
5. What are our priorities moving forward?

Q. Why complete a self-assessment?

A. There are several!

- Help your program understand your strengths and weaknesses, in order to achieve your grant's goals;
- Begin or continue a conversation with your partners to define common goals, and opportunities for collaboration;
- Identify priorities for action; and
- Identify, champion, and disseminate promising practices.

Q. How and when should we complete the self-assessment?

A. This tool is designed to be used as part of an continual learning process, as well as be useful in a variety of contexts:

- You can start today – your grants team can complete this self-assessment, and have internal conversations to help you plan outreach activities.
- This self-assessment can also be used as a focal point for your regular stakeholder meetings, or additionally as a way to bring in new partners.
- We recommend that you to revisit the self-assessment at regular, quarterly intervals to see what progress you have made, and correct course if necessary!

Grantee Self-Assessment FAQs



Q. Who should complete the self-assessment?

- A. Your team and your stakeholders including, but not limited to, employers, educational institutions, public sector partners, and community organizations. This process can help you understand where your partners are in understanding your goals, as well as Registered Apprenticeship more broadly.

Q. How long will it take?

- A. An individual should devote at least thirty minutes to thoughtfully completing the self-assessment. Group discussions of findings and results can vary depending on the setting.

Q. Can NGA help us work through the self-assessment?

- A. Yes! We will be utilizing this tool throughout the life of the grants, and can facilitate stakeholder meetings using the tool, or moderate discussions amongst your teams about your findings.

Q. How will the results be used?

- A. The results are for you. While NGA will use the results of these self-assessments to inform assistance, the information gathered by this Self-Assessment Tool **will not** be used to assess your program performance by anyone but you!
